Professor and Program Director of Human Development and Family Studies at Penn State University, Brandywine.

Her publications and professional presentations focus on adolescent peer culture, risk-taking, and identity development. Recent publications include *The Culture of Adolescent Risk-Taking* (1997, Guilford Press), *Sociogenetic Perspectives on Internalization* (1997, Lawrence Erlbaum Associates; edited with Brian Cox), and "Changing times: Essays on the development of self and culture", a special issue of the journal, *Culture and Psychology* (edited with Maria Lrya). She is active in several professional societies, currently serving as vice president to the Board of Directors of the Jean Piaget Society. Dr. Lightfoot has received several grants and awards, such as the PSU Project Empower Teaching Grant, the PSU International Cooperative Programs Global Fund Travel Award, the Presidential Research Award, and the Redcay Faculty Fellowship. Prior to teaching at Penn State University, Brandywine, Dr. Lightfoot taught at State University of New York at Plattsburgh, New York.

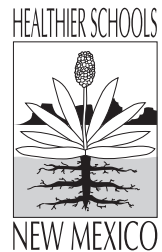
